





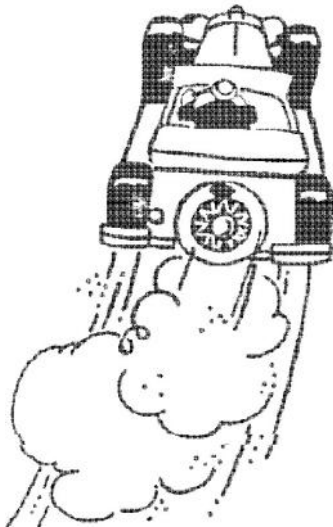
Note from the President Wichita A's Club Minutes

Tech Talk



Grady to the Rescue

During our tour to Liberal/Beaver in April of this year, **Jerry Allen** detected a “strange noise” in his 29 Tudor. After some investigation he determined that the crankshaft pulley was loose.

In the Super 8 parking lot **Scott Guinty** retrieved a modified 1 3/8”, 1/2” drive socket wrench from his tool box. With this socket and a 10” extension inserted into the crank hole, **Jerry** attempted to tighten the ratchet nut. No such luck, a shim or washer would be necessary. The ideal shim would have been a machinery type shim, 1 3/16” ID or larger but to find one of these in Liberal or Beaver at 4PM on Saturday would have been next to impossible. **Jerry** did find a 1/ 1/4” hardware type washer at Ace Hardware in Beaver, but the OD, 2 1/2”, was way too big to fit in the pulley.

So, **Francis Grady** put on his thinking cap, made some marks on the big washer and took off to O’Reillys’ Auto Parts. He explained his dilemma to the manager and asked if the store had a grinder he could use to fabricate the washer. The manager went to the shelf, took a new 4 1/2” grinder out of the box and handed it to **Grady** to use. He also took a new clamp off the shelf since they didn’t have a vice. **Grady**, assisted by **Frank Chenoweth** ground down the washer to a triangular shape and the manager refused payment. Naturally that gave **Grady** a “warm & fuzzy” feeling.

Back to the Super 8 the washer was installed and the loose pulley was tightened.

Actually, **Jerry’s** Tudor would probably have made it back to Wichita with the loose pulley, but the noise would have grown more intense and the pulley would have been ruined.

Word to the wise: The threads on the ratchet nut are 5/8” diameter. The crankshaft diameter is 1 3/16” diameter. A washer or shim any smaller than the crankshaft will tighten up against the end of the crankshaft and do nothing to secure the pulley. A loose pulley will still be loose. I’m speaking from experience. RG

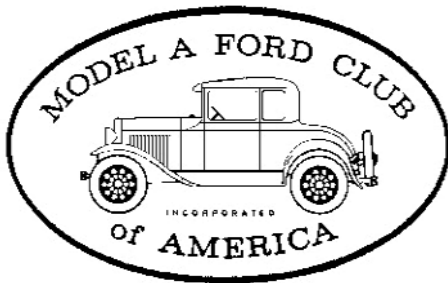
