Tech Talk



Marvel Mystery Oil

In about 1985, with the demise of regular leaded gas, I started to add Marvel Mystery Oil, about 4 oz every fill up to the gas in my Model A. I rationalized that without the lead in the gas the Model A valves needed extra lubrication for longevity. I also thought that the oil content in the tank might retard rust buildup as the result of condensation.

Although, in the 10 years prior, I had to do two valve jobs on My Model A each about 8 thousand miles apart using leaded gas. Most of these were road miles as we took our family vacations in our Model A and we went to several regional meets.

After starting this habit with the purchase of the Deluxe Phaeton in 1985 the next valve job was 11 years later in 1996 at 29 thousand miles, when the engine needed a complete overhaul. When we sold the Phaeton to the **Cushmans** in Jan. 08 the engine had registered another 29 thousand miles and is still running well today.

Is the longevity of this engine attributable to using Marvel Mystery Oil? I would be hard pressed to prove it but the history and success of the product has a very long and interesting history.

Burt Pierce founded the Marvel Oil Company in 1923.

His reputation for ingenuity preceded him as he was already well known for inventing the Marvel Carburetor which was standard equipment on 80% of the vehicles produced after WW 1.

Vehicles of the post WW 1 era encountered carburetor problems, the most perplexing being clogged jets due to high levels of contaminants found in the gasoline of the time. The problem motivated **Mr. Pierce** to direct his creative ingenuity towards formulating a blend of chemicals and petroleum products to clean and maintain clogged jets. He was successful beyond his wildest expectations and the legend was born!

“Mystery Oil” as it was originally called proved to have other beneficial effects on the engine. By creating a top ring seal, it produced higher compression and, by preventing blow-by on power strokes, it resulted in more power. Mystery oil also improved gas mileage and minimized engine wear.

Initially based in Chicago, the company moved to its long time home in Port Chester, NY, in 1941. There it remained until 1999, when Turtle Wax, Inc. purchased the company and moved it back to its hometown of Chicago.

Why the name Mystery Oil? **Mr. Pierce** refused to divulge the formula for this new product and answered all inquiries as to its contents with “It’s a Mystery”. The name caught on and is still recognized today for its “mysterious” ability to cure and prevent engine ailments.

Club member, **Jerry Allen**, who owns Allen Millwork reports that the company has used Marvel Mystery for many years

for air tool lubrication. Recently, Marvel has started to label a product specifically for, air tool lubrication so they have switched to that. The content may be the same as the old stuff.

Ralph Witte, former club member, now deceased, was a Field Engineer for Gates Rubber Company for many years. **Ralph** reported and was also intrigued that the oil field companies in North Central Kansas would purchase Marvel Mystery Oil in 55 gallon drums. We don't remember exactly what they used it for.

So, where can you buy Marvel Mystery Oil? Most all auto supply and parts stores, hardware stores, farm stores, and large retailers that have automotive departments.

This article is not meant to endorse or recommend Marvel Mystery Oil, but to report what we think is an interesting history that pre-dates the Model A Ford. **RG**

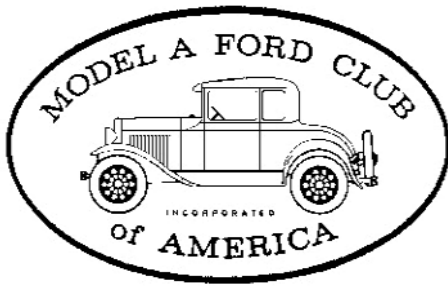
